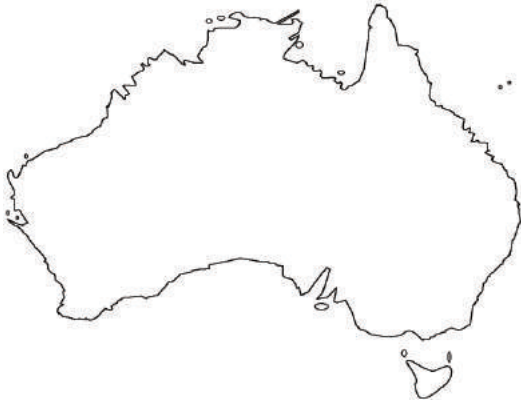


ACTIVITY SHEET: Yrs 3 - 6
