The sign of the Rainbow

Read the story in Genesis 7 -9

I'm sure you know the feeling when you are stuck in the house and it is raining heavily outside? It's okay for a little while, but after a few days' rain we are all glad to get outside and get some fresh air. Imagine listening to the rain outside for 40 days, day and night, and knowing you won't be going outside for a very long time. Maybe Noah's family wondered if they would ever get outside again!

But we have a God who doesn't forget His people. The Bible says, "And God remembered Noah". He sent a wind over the world and the rain stopped, and the water began to go down. Eventually the ark stopped moving. It settled on the mountains of Ararat.

What is the first thing you would like to do? The first thing I would want to do is get out of the ark! But if Noah had gone out at that point, he would have needed another boat - there was no dry land.

Noah was learning a lesson that we all need to learn - waiting on God. God told Noah to build an ark, but then he had to wait for at least 120 years before it was used, yet Noah believed God.
