The Entrance Gate

The Bible tells us there was just one entrance gate into the courtyard, where the Tabernacle was placed. This reminds us of the truth that there is only One way to come to God - through His Son Jesus, who said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me" (John 14:6). In fact, Jesus also used the example of a door: "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, He shall be saved" (John 10:9).

We are told the colours of the gate, which was made from a hanging cloth:

- **blue** - reminds us that Jesus came from Heaven.
- **Purple** - the colour of royalty. God sent the King of Kings to this earth for us!
- **Scarlet** - the colour of blood, reminding us of the price Jesus paid at the cross for us.
- **Fine linen** - reminds us that although the Lord Jesus was a real man, He was holy and pure.
