

Jesus rises from the dead

Read the story in John 20

When someone dies, and is buried, we can no longer see them. Their bodies slowly rot away in the earth, but their spirits and souls do not die. The Bible tells us about the importance of being ready to die, because our souls will live forever, either in Heaven or Hell, Are you ready?

The Lord Jesus Christ's death was very different. When He died, His body was put into a new sepulchre, which was like a large cave with a stone rolled across. Instead of His body staying there, however, after 3 days in the tomb. God raised Jesus from the dead again, and He became alive once more. Mary Magdalene was the first person to discover this. She told Peter and John, "They have taken away the Lord...and we know not where they have laid Him" (John 20:2). She didn't realise that Jesus had risen from among the dead. It wasn't until He came to her in the garden later on, and spoke to her, that she realised that it was Christ, and He had risen from the dead.

Do you know, He did not die again a second time? Instead, He went straight up into Heaven, through the air, in the clouds, right into the presence of God. (This is called His ascension.) Do you think an ordinary person could do this? Of course not! The resurrection and ascension prove that the Lord Jesus is God. Because He is God, He has the power that is needed to forgive sins for "Who can forgive sins but God only?" (Mark 2:7). He has power to forgive your sins too. The Bible tells us: "As many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name" (John 1:12).
